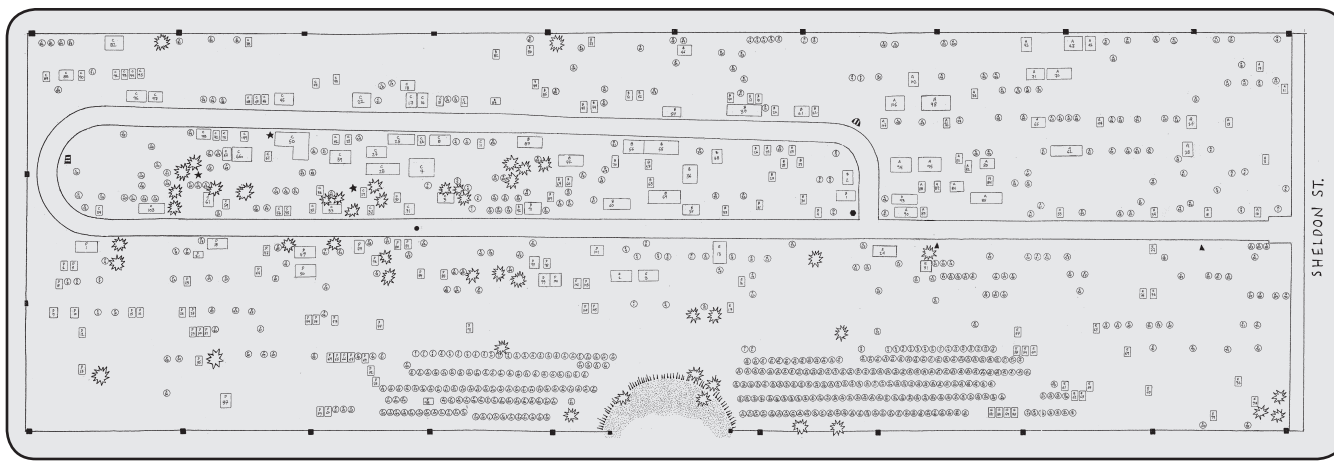


IMPORTANT – PLEASE READ

OVERVIEW MAP



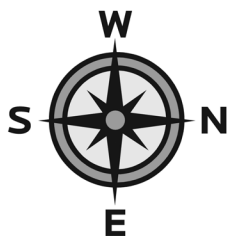

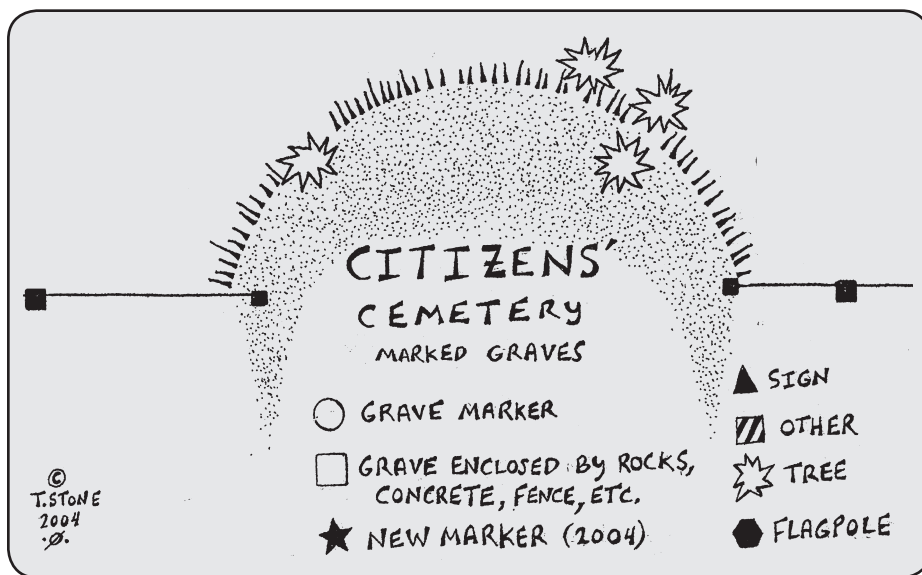

☞ **ABETT**, Jesus

GM-F16: "J. Abett, Died May 28, 00, Aged 40," concrete, 10" across.

Prescott Courier, May 30, 1900 – "Jesus Abett, a Mexican, aged around 35 years, died at the county hospital Monday."

☞ **ACOSTA**, Valazara

GM-G36: "Acosta, 1885–1910," concrete, 12" across.

DR09-12: Valazara Acosta, married Mexican male, born in Mexico, occupation: railroad laborer, died 3-17-10, aged 25, from pulmonary tuberculosis.

☞ **AIKEN**, LeRoy Lee

GM-E76: "Roy Lee Aiken, July 18, 1899, Sept. 16, 1910," granite, flat, 12" × 24", plot enclosed by stones, 3' × 7'.

DR09-12: White male child, born in Texas on 7-17-10, died 9-16-10, aged 11 (*note discrepancy between age and birth year*), general peritonitis. Contributing...appendicitis resulting in rupture.

Az. Journal-Miner, September 18, 1910 – "Popular Boy Laid to Rest – The funeral of Roy Lee Aiken, the 11-year-old son of M. W. Aiken of Jerome Junction, was held yesterday morning from the Ruffner chapel, and interment was had in the Citizen's cemetery. Many friends of the family were in attendance, from the city, while from Jerome Junction were his father, his sisters, Clara, Anna, Laurie, Amie, and Josie Aiken, and his brothers, Claude and Ray Aiken. Mr. And Mrs. W. R. Johnson and Mrs. W. R. Rhodes of Jerome Junction were also present. The bereaved relatives have the sympathy of all in their sorrow. The deceased was an unusually bright boy and very popular with all. Appendicitis was the fatal malady."

☞ **AIKEN**, William

GM-E87: "Wm. Blain Aiken, April 21, 1825, Nov. 12, 1906," granite, flat, 12" × 24".

RUFFNER: Vol. I, p. 114, W. B. Aiken, died 11-12-06, aged 81, from old age, burial cost was \$92.50.

☞ **ALBERA**, Edwardo

GM-D69: "Edwardo Albera, Died Sept. 3, 1932, Age 85," temporary metal marker, worn red sandstone marker with inscribed cross, 17"h × 25" across, shares plot with one other marker, *S. Reyes*, plot enclosed by concrete edging and gold-painted metal railing, 4' × 8'.

☞ **ALBRECHT**, Charles

GM-G1: "C. Albrecht, 1848–1911," concrete, 12" across, broken.

DR09-12: Widowed white male, born in Germany on 12-12-1847, occupation: porter, died 3-12-11, aged 63, from syphilis of brain.

☞ **ALDER**, W.

GM-G122: "W. Alder, Dec. 11, 02, Aged 68," concrete, 10" across, broken.

☞ **ALLEY**, Horace

GM-E20: "Horace G. Alley," granite on concrete, slightly damaged, flat, 10" × 17".

RUFFNER: Vol. XIII, p. 91, Horace G. Alley, died 4-6-25, aged 70, burial cost was \$135.00.

☞ **ALLRED**, Temple

GM-C107: "Temple T. Allred, 1857–1941," white marble embedded in concrete, flat, 12" × 15".

☞ **ALVAREZ**, Ramon

GM-F99: "Ramon Alvarez, Aug. 31, 1895–July 10, 1920," black granite on granite, 34"h × 22" across base.

☞ **ALYEA**, Joseph

GM-F14: "J. Alyea, Died Apr. 9, 00, Aged 73," concrete, 10" across.
